Our Year 11 and Year 13 students remain focused as they continue to prepare for their formal examinations. We are very proud of these two year groups. They have worked incredibly hard over the last two years, and we wish them all the best in the next few weeks. Our Year 11 students have now moved to their new 'Exam School' timetable and Year 13 have moved to 'Revision Wrapped Up'. Full details of both tailored programmes of support have been shared with the specific year groups. Evidence over time shows that this refined Exam School timetable provides valuable tailored support for our Year 11 students, and we expect full attendance to this. We hope that our newly introduced version for Year 13 will provide the same support to the year group also. Many thanks to Mr Giles, Associate Assistant Headteacher, for his ongoing work on the Year 11 Exam School and to Mrs Green, Director of Sixth Form, for developing the 'Revision Wrapped Up' programme.

Although this is the first time that our Year 9 students have taken their internal assessments in a much more formalised manner as PPEs, we are immensely proud of the mature way in which they have approached these. We know that some of them felt a little nervous about this, which is completely understandable. The PPEs allow our students to begin practising the formal examination processes ahead of the GCSEs that they will take in Year 11 and allows us to begin to implement reasonable adjustments that they may need to support them. This year group have been exceptional in the maturity they have demonstrated in their approach to the PPEs, and I cannot praise them enough for how they have worked with their teachers and other staff at the school. Equally, our Year 10 students, who are now much more familiar with the PPE process, have made an impressive start to these assessments.

I would like to say a public thank you to our Examinations and Data team who have been working tirelessly to ensure that systems are in place for the exam season, with particular thanks to Dr Bell, Assistant Headteacher, who is overseeing this work, Mrs Legg, our newly appointed Examinations Officer and Ms Adams, our newly appointed Data and Projects Lead. They have certainly hit the ground running with examinations and PPEs now in full swing.
